



# INFRASTRUCTURE

## OVERVIEW

The infrastructure of the TCC ABC Centres is designed to meet the needs of both the animals and the dedicated professionals who care for them.

## KENNELS AND ANIMAL HOUSING

Each zone is equipped with 12 kennels, except Zone I, which has 17 kennels. These kennels provide temporary housing for animals before and after surgeries, ensuring a safe and comfortable recovery environment.

# FIRST DOG CATCHERS AND ANIMAL HANDLERS TRAINING PROGRAMME IN TAMIL NADU



THE FIRST TRAINING PROGRAMME FOR ANIMAL HANDLERS AND DOG CATCHERS, ORGANIZED UNDER TNAWB'S 2023-24 INITIATIVE TO ENHANCE ABC FACILITIES, WAS INAUGURATED ON 23.04.2024 AT THE VETERINARY UNIVERSITY TRAINING AND RESEARCH CENTRE, TIRUCHIRAPALLI. MS. SHRUTHI VINODRAJ, A KEY HONORARY MEMBER OF TNAWB, HIGHLIGHTED THE PROGRAMME'S OBJECTIVES AND ITS ROLE IN STRENGTHENING HUMANE ANIMAL CONTROL PRACTICES. ALONG WITH DR. A. P. NAMBI AND OTHER OFFICIALS, SHE EMPHASIZED THE SIGNIFICANCE OF ETHICAL ANIMAL HANDLING IN PUBLIC HEALTH EFFORTS.



# PIONEERING ANIMAL CARE AROUND THE CLOCK



IN 2024, OUR ORGANIZATION ENHANCED ITS ANIMAL WELFARE EFFORTS BY INTRODUCING EVENING CATCHING INITIATIVES, ENSURING SWIFT RESPONSE TO CANINE-RELATED COMPLAINTS AND EMERGENCIES EVEN DURING NIGHTTIME. THIS MILESTONE REFLECTS OUR DEDICATION TOWARDS ACHIEVING ZERO RABIES DEATHS. BY OPERATING TIRELESSLY AND ADDRESSING EMERGENCIES PROMPTLY, WE REMAIN COMMITTED TO FOSTERING A HARMONIOUS COEXISTENCE BETWEEN HUMANS AND ANIMALS



# DOG POPULATION MANAGEMENT SURVEY



THE DOG POPULATION MANAGEMENT (DPM) SURVEY IN TCC WAS CONDUCTED IN SEPTEMBER 2024 BY THE WORLDWIDE VETERINARY SERVICE (WVS) IN COLLABORATION WITH TCC AND ANIMALS HELPING HANDS (AHH). THE SURVEY AIMED TO ASSESS THE FREE-ROAMING DOG POPULATION, STERILIZATION COVERAGE, AND OVERALL ANIMAL HEALTH, PROVIDING ESSENTIAL DATA FOR FUTURE MANAGEMENT STRATEGIES.

## KEY FINDINGS

- ◆ COVERED ALL 65 WARDS OF TCC, SPANNING 164.70 KM<sup>2</sup>
- ◆ ESTIMATED FREE-ROAMING DOG POPULATION: 43,767 (95% CI: 36,538 - 50,997)
- ◆ DOG DENSITY: 56 DOGS/KM<sup>2</sup>, DOG ABUNDANCE: 12 DOGS/KM
- ◆ HUMAN-TO-DOG RATIO: 19.36 (~5 DOGS PER 100 HUMANS)
- ◆ STERILIZATION/NEUTER COVERAGE: 47%, HIGHEST IN WARD 30 (91%), LOWEST IN WARD 64 (7%)
- ◆ MOST ADULT DOGS WERE IN GOOD HEALTH, BUT SOME HAD SKIN DISEASES OR OTHER HEALTH ISSUES

## SURVEY IMPLEMENTATION & METHODOLOGY


- ◆ CONDUCTED 195 SURVEYS (THREE PER WARD) USING SMARTPHONE BASED DATA COLLECTION APPS (WVS APP & STRAVA)
- ◆ SURVEYS INVOLVED DIRECT OBSERVATION OF FREE-ROAMING DOGS ACROSS PRE-MAPPED TRANSECT ROUTES.
- ◆ COLLECTED DATA ON DOG DEMOGRAPHICS, HEALTH STATUS, NEUTER COVERAGE, AND POPULATION ESTIMATES.
